



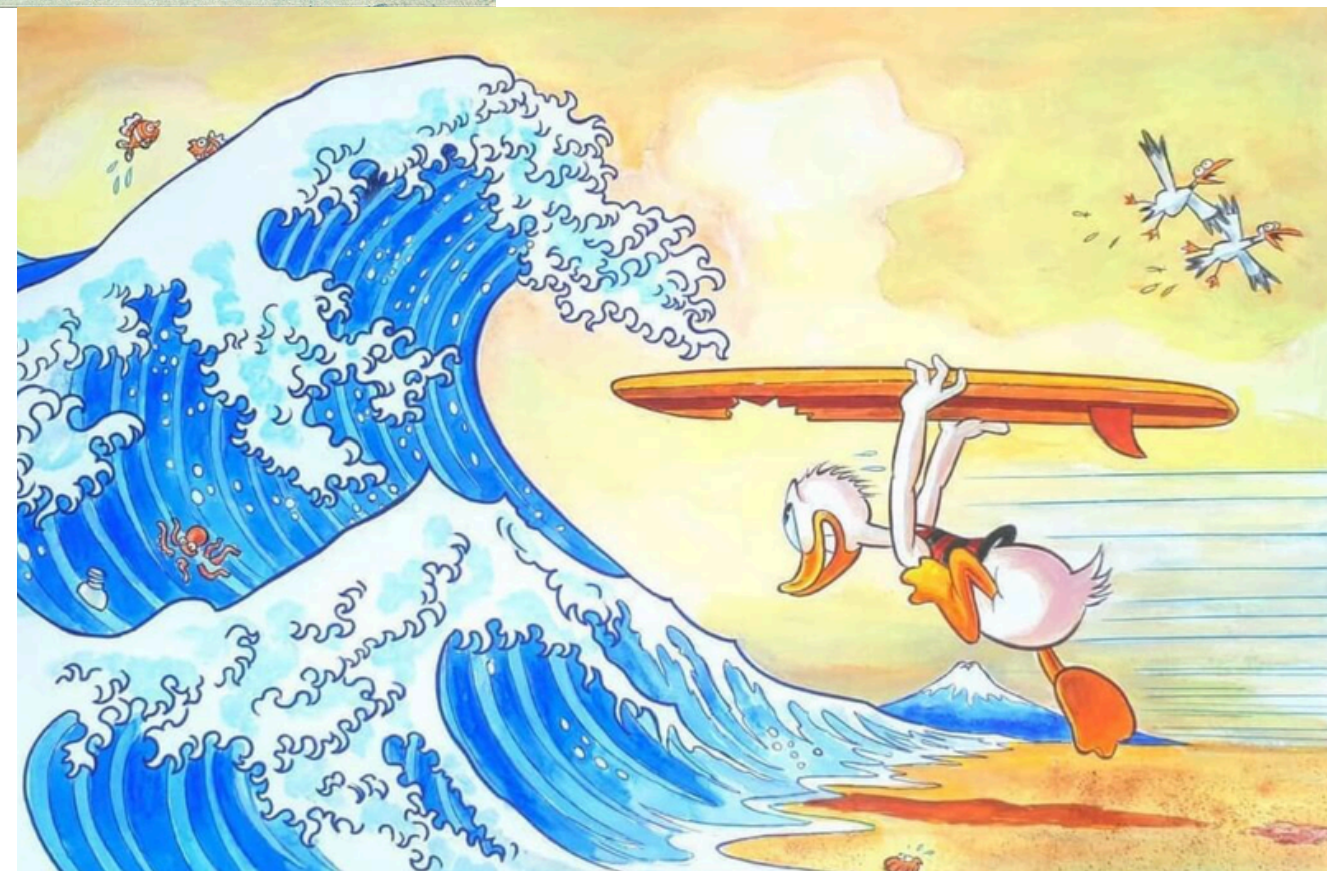
'**Under the Wave off Kanagawa**' is a woodblock print by the Japanese artist **Hokusai** (1760–1849), created in late 1831 during the Edo period of Japanese history.

The print depicts three boats moving through a storm-tossed sea, with a large, cresting wave forming a spiral in the centre over the boats and Mount Fuji in the background.

The Great Wave off Kanagawa has been described as "**possibly the most reproduced image in the history of all art**", as well as being a contender for the "**most famous artwork in Japanese history**". This woodblock print has influenced several Western artists and musicians (Claude Debussy, Vincent van Gogh, Claude Monet)
