

Vasilis Marmatakis

Vasilis Marmatakis is a Greek graphic designer and creative director based in Athens. After studying Graphic Design at Camberwell College of Arts and completing a Master's degree at the Royal College of Art in London, he further developed his practice as a researcher at the Jan van Eyck Academie in Maastricht. Marmatakis co-founded the design studio MNP in 2003 before establishing himself as a freelance designer and visiting lecturer at Vakalo College of Art and Design.¹

He works across various media for a diverse range of projects including print, film, exhibition design and web, but he is best known for his long-term collaboration with filmmaker Yorgos Lanthimos and creating award-winning posters for films such as Dogtooth, The Lobster, The Favourite, and Poor Things.^{2,3}

His work is very conceptual and hides a lot of symbolism, and his process is highly experimental. He favours analogue techniques such as collage, hand-cut imagery, and he also manipulates typography physically rather than relying on digital fonts only.⁴
